The position is situated within the Department of Health Sciences in the School of Health and Biomedical Sciences. The school is dedicated to delivering practical solutions to global health challenges through interdisciplinary teaching and research. It offers programs across various fields, including psychology, physiotherapy, nursing, pharmacy and medical radiations.

RMIT University is organised into several colleges, with the School of Health and Biomedical Sciences falling under the STEM College, that incorporates the fields of sciences, engineering, computing technologies and health and medical sciences. Position Summary

A Lecturer in Occupational Therapy will contribute to the teaching and research efforts of the School, in disciplines related to their field of expertise, and with community, professional, commercial and industry groups.

This position is the **second appointment in the Discipline of Occupational Therapy** (OT) at RMIT University and will be integral in working on the design, development and delivery of a new program in OT (subject to review by the Occupational Therapy Council and receiving full approval from the University).

RMIT Classification: Trusted

More specifically, the Lecturer is responsible for carrying out teaching activities within coursework programs and for maintaining and advancing their scholarly, research and/or professional capabilities. The Lecturer is also expected to actively promote the program by establishing and maintaining memberships, links and partnerships with academic, industry and professional communities.

The Lecturer is expected to work collaboratively and collegially with fellow academics within the teaching team, and update colleagues and students on developments in their subject area or specialisation. The Lecturer may be responsible for course coordination.

Reporting Line

Reports to: Assistant Associate Dean (Occupational Therapy)

Direct reports: N/A

In relation to any course coordination, the Lecturer is responsible to the relevant Program Manager.

Key Accountabilities

- Undertake independent teaching at undergraduate, honours and postgraduate level including: designing, conducting and moderating assessment; implementing improvements informed by course evaluation activities and student feedback.
- 2. Undertake independent professional activities, scholarship and/or conduct high quality research activities appropriate to the profession or discipline including: managing individual projects within timelines and budgets and ensuring compliance with quality and reporting requirements; publishing research results in high quality outlets as lead or co-author; preparing and submitting external research funding applications; and supervising higher degree by research candidates.
- 3. Undertake administration duties, which may include course coordination role or management of a small award program.

Key Selection Criteria

- 1. Leadership in innovative teaching and curriculum development, including technology-enhanced learning approaches, and the ability to undertake the role of course coordinator.
- 2. Demonstrated ability to create and support a positive, student-centred learning culture that fosters engagement, inclusion, and academic excellence.
- 3. Experience in or understanding of internal and external quality assurance and accreditation processes
- 4. The communication and advocacy skills to build and sustaining strong partnerships with health services, community organisations, and professional bodies.
- 5. An emerging track record and recognition for quality research outputs which will contribute to existing Discipline and School research areas evidenced by publications, development of new research initiatives, competitive research funding, and industry links.
- 6. Demonstrated ability to supervise higher degree by research candidates.
- 7. Demonstrated ability to contribute to a collaborative and supportive team environment focused on achieving shared goals and delivering high-quality outcomes.

Qualifications

Mandatory: PhD or equivalent¹ in relevant field, and eligibility to register as an Occupational Therapist with the Occupational Therapy Board of Australia.

Note: Appointment to this position is subject to passing a Working with Children Check and other checks as required by the specific role. Maintaining a valid Working With Children Check is a condition of employment at RMIT.

Preferred: Completion of the <u>Intro to Learning and Teaching Course (Login required)</u> or possess (or eligible to apply for) appropriate HEA Fellowship (login required).
