Title: Rethinking Remoteness: Relationality between the Human and the Environment in

Indigenous Oceanian Literature (1970-2020)

Abstract:

This study will investigate the representations of relationships to land in a corpus of 16 Oceanian novels. It will explore how Oceanian understandings of identity and relationality—as they are represented in Indigenous novels emerging from the region could allow for a reconsideration of sustainability and ecology and question the modern Western erected distances between the human, non-human and "symbioment" (Albrecht 2019) primarily from an Indigenous standpoint. Reflecting on the artivist dimension of Indigenous novels relating and enacting Indigenous relationality to land it will ponder on the power of storytelling may have on readers' ethical repositioning in a time of anthropogenic climate crisis.
