Property Services is located in the Operations Portfolio which is the services nucleus of RMIT and the focus for the development of the finance, people development infrastructure and systems that provide administrative capacity to the University.

Property Services has approximately 120 staff and has the responsibility to operate, maintain and enhance the buildings owned and leased by RMIT University, oversee construction projects and ensure the provision of physical facilities services.

Property Services is responsible for a Property Portfolio of \$2.9B with an operating budget in excess of \$80M and prospective capital projects of over \$100M per annum for the next few years in Melbourne and Vietnam. RMIT's built environment involves approximately 110 buildings in Melbourne spread across all RMIT's campuses and sites.

Position Summary

The Advisor, Health Safety & Environment will assist in the management of risk mitigation across all aspects of contractor, maintenance and project works at RMIT within the Property Services Group.

This role will be responsible for identifying and managing risks especially those of construction, maintenance and contractor work in a complex live working environment. This role will work closely with the Property Service Safety team and Health Safety and Wellbeing Team across the University, to ensure legislative compliance.

The role will be part of the Safety Team of Property Services and will report to the Manager, HSE Governance & Systems.

Key Accountabilities

- Assist in the implementation and management of RMIT OHS Policies and Procedures and oversee the health and safety aspects of contractor, maintenance and project works at RMIT within the Property Services Group.
- Interpret, support and advise line managers and project stakeholders on relevant occupational health and safety legislation and University policies and procedures where appropriate, including RMIT Global Safety Model (GSM).
- Use a collaborative approach with other staff, managers, contractors and external providers to ensure the development and delivery of best practice health and safety solutions.
- Monitor the various projects, construction sites and contractors working for Property Services Group to ensure compliance to RMIT standards for OHS by all contractors; consult building codes, government regulations and other emergency response agencies to ensure that the workplace is compliant with health, safety and environmental regulations.
- Conduct regular planned and unplanned workplace inspections and safety audits.
- Assist with investigations of serious incidents; conduct investigations of minor incidents; liaise with external bodies and co-ordinate interventions by regulatory bodies.
- Assist in the development and implementation of health, safety and environment KPI's for regular reporting against projects and operational delivery.
- Monitor and review project contractors to ensure health and safety provisions such as inductions are in place and actively being done.
- Assist with the development of health, safety training materials and deliver inductions and other applicable health, safety and environment training as required.

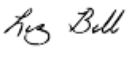
Key Selection Criteria

4. Demonstrated ability to diagnose, analyse, conceptualise and provide creative solutions to complex projects and issues.

6. Ability to work independently, flexibly, co-operatively and efficiently as a member of a client-focused team.
7. Proven ability to develop clear and concise written communications including business, investigative and audit reports and proposals.
