Additionally:

- In the 2019 QS World University Rankings by Subject, RMIT was positioned 12th in the world (highest ranked in Australia) in Art and Design, 22nd in the world (fourth highest in Australia) in Architecture and the Built Environment, and 37th in Media and Communications. We are also among the world's top 100 universities in Engineering (Civil and Structural; Electrical and Electronic; and Mechanical, Mechanical, Aeronautical and Manufacturing); Accounting and Finance; and Business and Management Studies).
- In the 2018 QS Rankings by Subject, RMIT was ranked 11th in the world and number one in the Asia Pacific for Art and Design, and 26th in Architecture and the Built Environment. RMIT is also among the world's top 100 universities in Engineering (Civil and Structural; Electrical and Electronic; and Computer Science and Information Systems); Accounting and Finance; Business and Management Studies; and Communication and Media Studies. The 2018 Shanghai Ranking's Global Ranking of Academic Subjects highlighted RMIT's strength in Engineering and Technology in particular.
- In the specialised rankings, RMIT is ranked 77th in the QS Graduate Employability Rankings 2020 and 82nd in the inaugural Times Higher Education University Impact Rankings 2019.
- RMIT also ranks in the world's **top 400** in the 2019 Academic Ranking of World Universities and in the world's **top 400** in 2020 Times Higher Education World University Rankings.

Position Summary

This role is critical to the effectiveness of the International and Engagement Portfolio. The Admissions Project Officer will work in collaboration with operational units across the Pathways and Operations teams to support both cyclical and ad-hoc system-based projects that support key Admissions activities for international and domestic students, provide a high level of systems operational analysis and process advice to bring about improvements to University's activities. The underpinning project of this role is the management of process, system and key activities throughout the year to support the annual VTAC cycle.

The Admissions Project Officer will assist in the delivery of services to students by validating critical data for accuracy from the University's primary admissions and associated systems and applications and will support key staff across Admissions related projects, particularly related but not limited to VTAC as well as 'Business as Usual' activities. Other tasks will include participation in systems projects offering advice regarding student administration processes; undertake User Acceptance Testing; collect and document business requirements for system development and participate in project workshops. During peak VTAC periods, the Admissions Project Officer will be required to work outside of normal working hours or on weekends where certain processes or workloads necessitate.

Organisational Accountabilities

Key Accountabilities

- Support strategic Admissions projects related to VTAC admissions and related systems.
- Undertake system configuration for admissions and administration systems as well as inter-related systems.
- Participate in Admissions system projects, offering specialised advice regarding student administration processes, collect and document business requirements for system development; participation in project workshops and contributing to continual process improvement.
- Ensure the integrity (Quality Assurance) of student data: imported and exported from the student management system; configured in the system and any data analysis that is undertaken.
- Provide a high standard of service to internal and external stakeholders, including expert advice on admissions policies and work practices; engage in regular liaison with staff involved in admissions and related activities

- Ability to understand policy across VTAC, University, government legislation and regulators by interpreting and applying them to daily tasks.
- Analyse and report on admissions processes and systems; develop recommendations for improvement; plan and lead improvement projects under broad direction.

Key Selection Criteria

1. Demonstrated knowledge with experience in the use of databases; reporting tools and the relationship between system set up and the associated administrative processes and practices.
2. Demonstrated experience to understand system linkage and process improvement.
3. Demonstrated ability to undertake system analysis; data analyse and troubleshoot issues.
4. Ability to prioritise work and to manage conflicting deadlines without compromising quality.
5. Commitment to working as part of a team, including the ability to assist or guide others in areas where experience has been gained.
6. Demonstrated communication skills: document and present issues, solutions and processes to wide ranging internal audience.
7. Ability to work productively within an environment that is subject to and embraces change with a focus towards improvement.
8. Ability to ensure data integrity through demonstrated attention to detail and quality data input
9. Understanding the process used for gathering business requirements for projects, would be an advantage but not essential.

Qualifications

- A bachelor's degree and/or substantial relevant experience are required; or an equivalent combination of relevant experience and/or education/training.
- Experience within both the Higher Education and Vocational Education and Training sectors, preferably in admissions and selection of applicants.
- Understanding of VTAC policy and protocols, and experience using VTAC systems (ViaOnline, VOICES) for the purposes of maintaining published course offerings and undertaking student selection.
- This role requires satisfactory confirmation of a Working with Children Check.
