Automation

Al is no longer just the domain of the tech industry. In the business and management sector, Al is creating new methods of automation. Many industry professionals see this innovation as a way to create greater efficiencies. Take for example, Salesforce's Chief Adoption Officer Polly Sumner who says businesses should embrace Al by "[starting] with automation and free up people to do what they do best, more quickly and in more interesting ways."



Sustainable business

In an era of innovation and progress, sustainability is on everyone's mind. Australia's commitment to the 'Net Zero Plan' will become even more relevant as 2050 approaches. Businesses and entire sectors will be held to new sustainable standards.² It's not just government driving this trend - according to a joint survey by McKinsey and NielsenIQ, companies that are transparent about the sustainability of their products have shown increased sales growth and brand trust.³





Digital business management

Since 2020, there has been a dramatic uptake in remote working business models. In 2024, 36% of all employed Australians regularly worked from home.⁴ This is just one of the widely felt changes that is driving employers and executives to integrate more digital business management into their organisations. As such, digital systems continue to evolve the way businesses are managed, and tech literacy will become even more valued by employers and executives.



Al in fintech

The integration of AI models into the financial sector has already begun⁵, but the innovations have only scratched the surface of what's possible. The speed at which AI can process data means that many new efficiencies can be achieved, giving senior finance professionals the ability to make more accurate and more complex data driven decisions. Even new starters in the finance sector can use AI to stay informed about tax and legislative changes.⁶



Data governance

Collecting and analysing data isn't a new trend, however the tools and expertise have changed in recent years.. Analysts are more empowered than ever with data governance training and tech that allows them to create visualisations and models at a moment's notice. Tools such as PowerBI and Tableau are becoming essential, and so too is empowering employees with the means to make data-driven decisions.¹


