## About the event

Climate change presents significant challenges for the future development, sustainability and resilience of Melbourne suburbs. Between the 1990s and 2030s, it is estimated that daily maximum temperatures in Greater Melbourne will increase by 0.8 to 1.6°C, with more heat extremes and intensive rainfall. There will be an increasing risk of climate change-related events such as drought, heatwaves, storms and bushfires.

The low-density development pattern in Melbourne's middle and outer suburbs contributes to climate change hazards through the greenhouse gas associated with high land and material consumption, loss of biodiversity, and high reliance on car travel. Land use also combines with climatic and biophysical factors such as water flows and heat to generate climate change impacts.

What are the key opportunities for climate change mitigation and adaptation in urban planning, transport, energy, urban greening, water and waste management?

This webinar presents the recommendations of a report and policy brief aimed at promoting sustainability and resilience in Melbourne's suburbs and support achievement of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
