Full names, addresses, passport numbers, visa grant numbers / Client ID / Application ID / file numbers and ImmiCard numbers are redacted in these examples.

In your document submission, only redact (cross out/black out) your visa grant numbers, passport numbers, document numbers or ImmiCard numbers, if visible. **Do not** redact your full name and visa subclass or it will be considered ineligible.

Eligible refugee subclasses are **200, 201, 202, 203, 204** and **866** (current or past visa).

Ineligible visa types are student visas, temporary visas, temporary protection visas, safe haven enterprise visas, resolution of status visa, bridging visas, family and partner visas, permanent resident visas, visitor visas, working and skilled visas.

Refugee evidence should include:

- the applicant's full name, and
- visa subclass.

The following documents can be used as evidence:

- A copy of your Australian Permanent Humanitarian Visa
- A copy of your Visa Grant Notice
- A copy of your Visa Entitlement Verification Online (VEVO) check
- A copy of your Document for travel to Australia
- Refugee documentation from the Department of Immigration and Border Protection/Department of Home Affairs

The following information should be redacted:

- Application ID / File number
- Visa Grant number
- ImmiCard number
- Passport number

**Visa Entitlement Verification Online (VEVO)
Visa Details Check**

This document contains the result of a Visa Entitlement Verification Online (VEVO) Visa Details Check and is valid as at Tuesday August 23, 2022 10:10:18 (AEST) Canberra, Australia (GMT +1000).

Important information about VEVO

A VEVO check shows the visa details and conditions associated with a particular visa holder, such as work or study rights. VEVO Visa Details Checks are only current at the time conducted and should only be considered valid when received directly from the VEVO system. Not all visas allow people to work. Some Australian visas have work conditions which may include not being able to work at all or only being able to work with a certain employer or a specific number of hours. Foreign nationals who do not have a valid visa are not allowed to work in Australia. Employers are strongly encouraged to conduct their own VEVO Visa Details Check as it is a criminal offense to hire or refer illegal workers in Australia. Employers who hire, or refer workers without the right to work, face serious penalties including fines or imprisonment. With the permission of the visa holder, registered employers may conduct a VEVO Visa Details Check to confirm the visa details and conditions of employees. 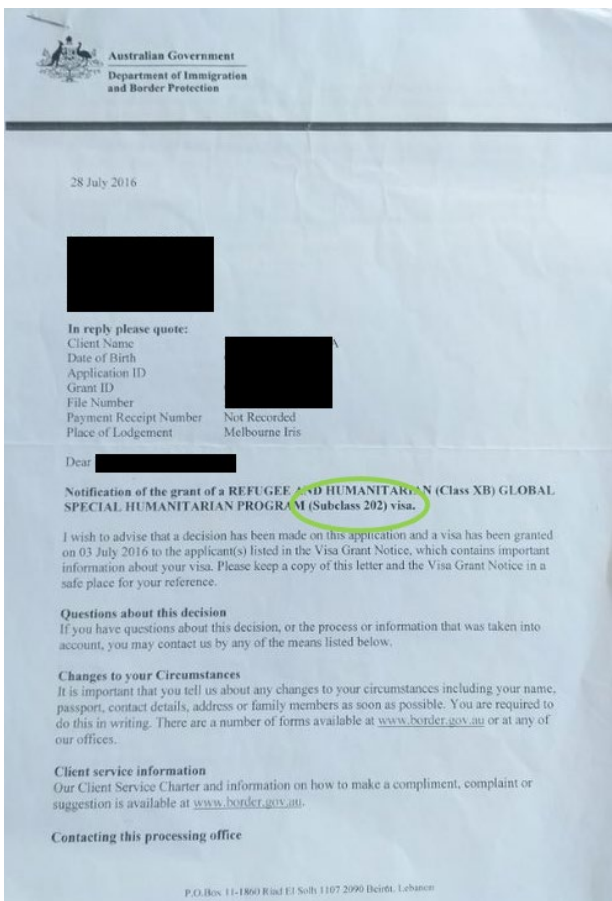
