Computer and phone instructions

Before you start

On your mobile phone, install the **Microsoft Authenticator** app. Use the QR code for your phone's operating system to go to the app store.



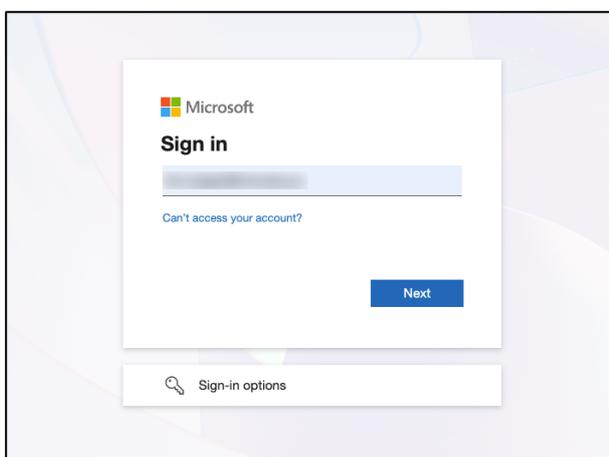

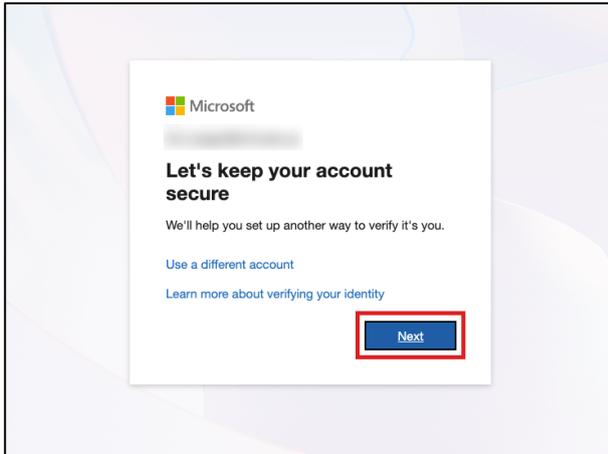

Set up the Microsoft Authenticator app

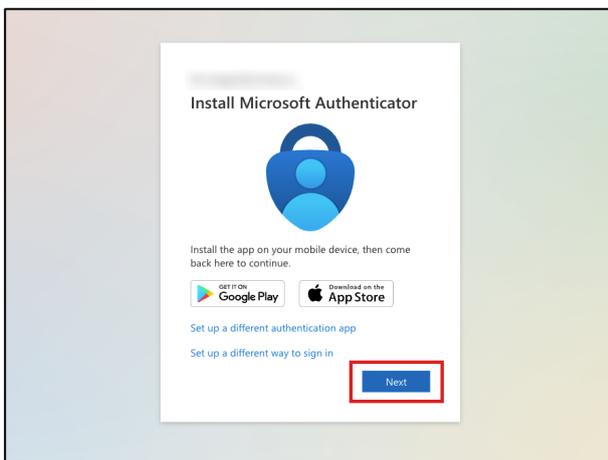
1. On your computer, go to aka.ms/mfasetup
2. If prompted, sign in with your **RMIT email address and password**.



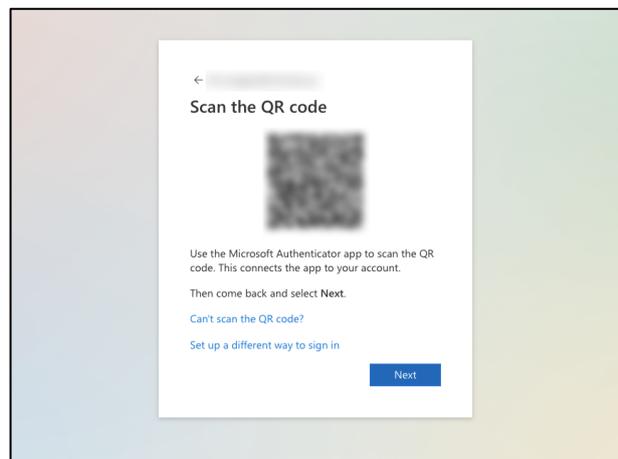
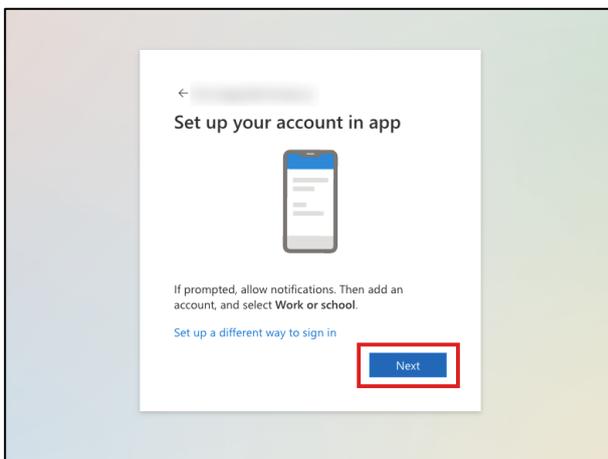
3. Select **Next**.



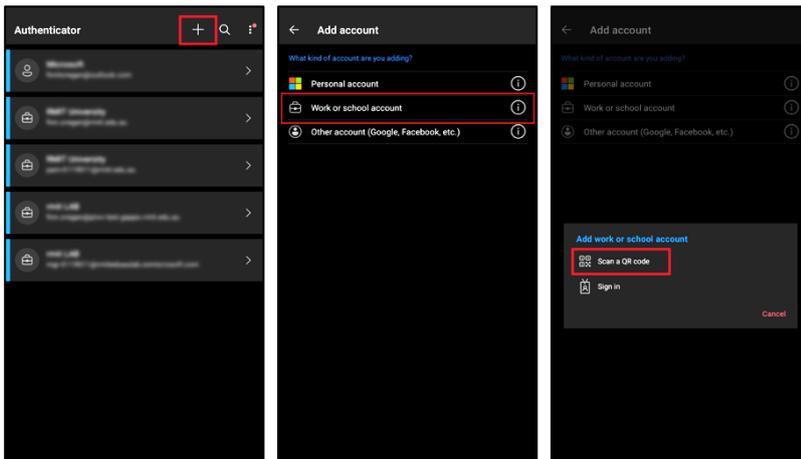
4. Select **Next** again.



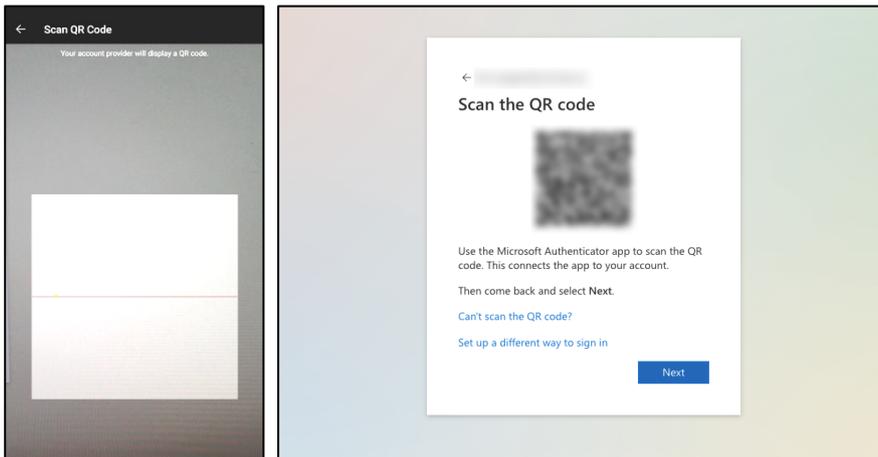
5. Select **Next** once more. A QR code will appear on your screen.



6. On your phone, open the **Microsoft Authenticator** app, then select the + icon > **Work or school account** > **Scan a QR code**.

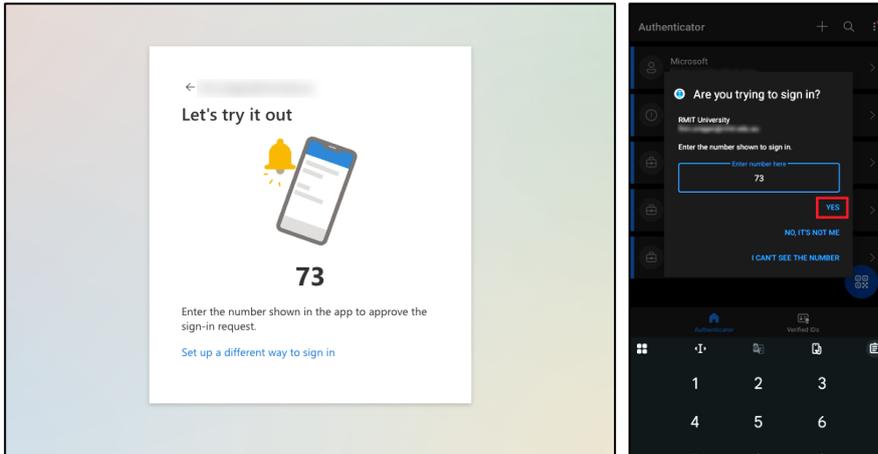


7. Use your phone to scan the QR code displayed on your computer.

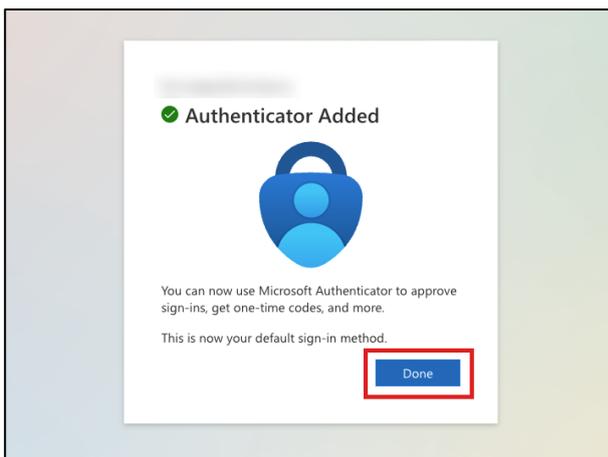


8. On your computer, select **Next**.

9. A notification will be sent to your phone. **Enter the number** shown on your computer into the Microsoft Authenticator prompt on your phone and select **Yes** to approve.



10. Select **Done** on your computer.

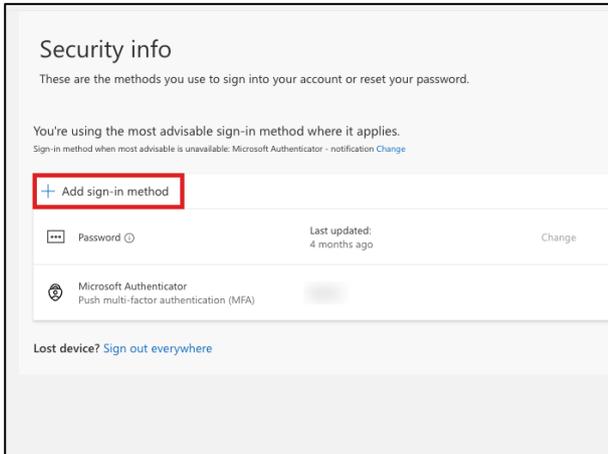


11. If you're asked whether you want to stay signed in:

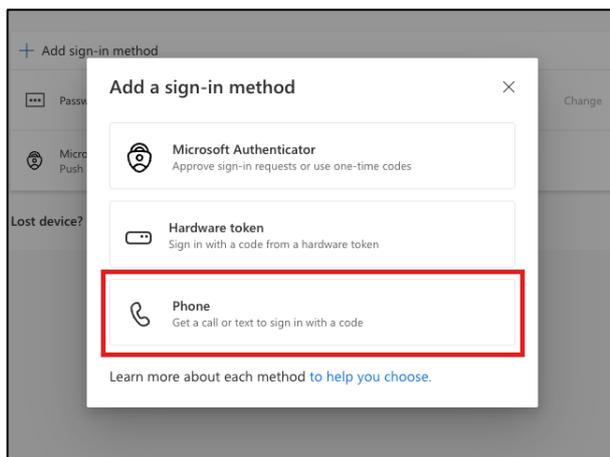
- Select **No** if other people use this computer, or
- Select **Yes** if you're the only user.

Add your mobile number as a backup method

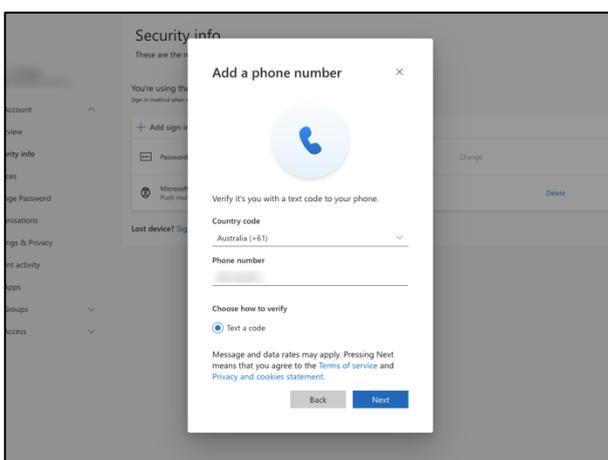
12. On the security info page, select + Add sign in method.



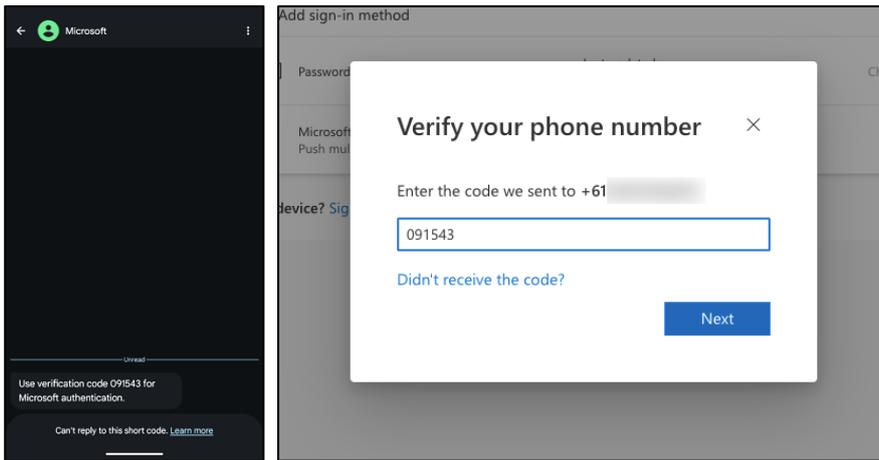
13. Choose **Phone**.



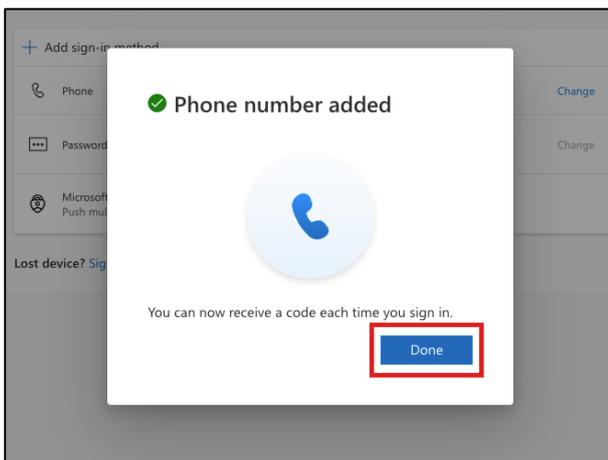
14. Select your **country code** and **enter your mobile number**, then select **Next**.



15. Enter the **verification code** sent to your phone, then select **Next**.



16. Select **Done**.



Your MFA is now set up with Microsoft Authenticator, and your mobile number is added as a backup method.
