Examples of eligible Centrelink Health Care / Concession Card documentation

Full names, addresses and Customer Reference Numbers (CRN) are redacted in these examples. **Do not** redact these details when you submit your documentation for a scholarship application, or it will be considered ineligible.

The most common reasons for documentation being marked as ineligible are:

- The scholarship applicant's full name is not visible
- Date of the card expiry is not visible, or the expiry is before the application submission date
- The type of payment is not visible
- The type of payment is not eligible*

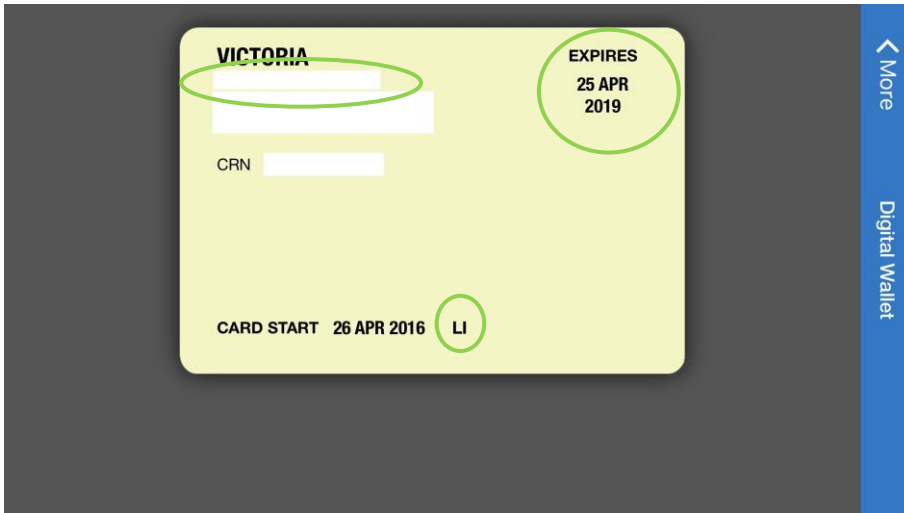

If you receive a Parenting Payment, a copy of your eligible low-income health care card is preferred. If your most recent statement (within 3 months) clearly shows that you receive the maximum payment rate, you can also provide this evidence.

If your statement does not show that you receive the maximum Parenting Payment, and you do not have a current low-income health care card, your Parenting Payment statement **must** be accompanied by an ATO Notice of Assessment to be considered.





Eligible because:

- Full name (redacted in this image) was visible
- Expiry date is visible (and expiry was not before the time of application submission)
- Type of card visible (LI – low income)*

Please note: if this card was submitted in a scholarship application on or after 26 April 2019 it would be considered ineligible as it would be expired.



Eligible because:

- Full name (redacted in this image) was visible
- Expiry date is visible (and expiry was not before the time of application submission)
- Type of card visible (DSP – disability support pension)*

Please note: if this card was submitted in a scholarship application on or after 1 May 2019 it would be considered ineligible as it would be expired.
