French 1	A0 / A1
French 2	A1 / A2
French 3	A2
French 4	A2 / B1
French 5	B1
French 6	B1/B2
French 7	B2
French 8	B2 / C1

Note:

- A 'B2' level is the minimum level required to study in French in a French/Francophone university.
- C1 (& C2) corresponds to a native speaker level.
- The CEFR indicates levels of knowledge and abilities in a language and not so much levels of cultural knowledge associated to the language.

\*The **Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CERF)**, is a guideline used to describe achievements of learners of foreign languages across Europe and, increasingly, in other countries.
