

Northern Health - Diploma of Nursing (Enrolled-Division 2 Nursing) Industry Model.

Enrolled nurses help to provide acute, preventive, curative and rehabilitative care, under the direction of a registered nurse.

The Enrolled Nursing program at RMIT University, in collaboration with Northern Health provides students with a technology enhanced learning experience using simulation laboratories and a new web based simulation experience that can be accessed by students online at any time. The simulation experience combined with a minimum 600 hours of work placement ensures that students are well prepared to be work-ready graduates.

Graduates of this program may continue with further studies through the Bachelor of Nursing degree.

Industry Connections

With supervised clinical placements, you'll reinforce the theory and skills learned in class while gaining real-world experience in a healthcare environment.

You will be complete a minimum of 600 hours (15 weeks) of supervised clinical placement.

Career Outlook

There is a high demand for enrolled nurses and job expectations are strong.

Enrolled nurses help to provide acute, preventive, curative and rehabilitative care, under the direction of a registered nurse.

Graduates can work in:

- acute (hospital) care
- medical centres
- mental health
- rehabilitation
- palliative care
- aged care settings.

Professional Recognition

The Diploma of Nursing is nationally accredited.

Students may apply to the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) upon completing the program for registration as an Enrolled Nurse.

AHPRA is governed by the Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council (ANMAC). AHPRA registration enables graduates to practice anywhere in Australia.



Pathways

Graduates may be eligible for credit of up to one year (equivalent of 96 credit points) into the RMIT Bachelor of Nursing if successful in gaining a place.

Graduates completing their program more than twelve months prior to their application but less than ten years will also require registration as an Enrolled Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.

Entry Requirements

You must have successfully completed an Australian Year 12 or an equivalent. Educational history including ATAR and GPA will be considered.

English language requirements:

This only applies to International and local students who have not completed five years of secondary study in Australia, United Kingdom, Canada, New Zealand, Republic of Ireland, South Africa or United States of America.

To study this program you will need to complete one of the following English proficiency tests:

- IELTS (Academic): minimum overall band of 7.0 (with no individual band less than 7.0)
- TOEFL (Internet Based Test IBT): minimum overall score of 94 (with minimum score of 24 in listening and reading and 27 in writing and 23 in speaking)
- Pearson Test of English (Academic) (PTE (A)): minimum score of 65 (with no communication band less than 65)

You must provide evidence of meeting the English language requirement as part of your application.
