Planners do more than just create physical environments: they sustainably change and shape the world, helping urban and rural environments adapt to meet the current and future needs of the population.

Planners are being called upon to address key challenges including preserving our extensive natural landscape, reducing our reliance on the automobile, incorporating open public spaces into the city and adapting the built form to respond to climate change.

By studying RMIT's Bachelor of Urban and Regional Planning, you'll be introduced to planning practices both locally and internationally.

Accredited by the Planning Institute of Australia (PIA), this degree will provide you with the opportunity to participate in real-life projects with leading industry professionals.

You'll also be eligible for a student membership with the PIA.

Career outlook

You can work for local or state government or find work with private sector planning consultancies and property developers. Beyond the built environment, you can also work as a planner in urban design, community health and welfare, housing and transport.

You will finish by writing either an individual thesis or a major professional report on a chosen topic.
