What is Academic Integrity?

Academic integrity is about the honest presentation of your academic work. It means acknowledging the work of others while developing your own insights, knowledge and ideas.

What is plagiarism?

Plagiarism is when you present the work, ideas or creations of another person, without appropriate citations, as if it is your own.

Why is plagiarism wrong?

- It is a form of fraud—you are stealing someone else's work and ideas.
- It may be a breach of copyright law.
- You are denying yourself a valuable learning experience.
- It devalues the original work of other students.
- It goes against the university's principle of graduating independent thinkers.

- Plagiarise
- Cheat in an exam
- Copy or submit whole or parts of computer files as if they are your own
- Submit purchased pre-written or on-demand papers from cheat sites and essay writing companies.

Possible Consequences

- Assessment failure
- Course failure
- Cancelled results
- Suspension (up to 12 months)
- Expulsion

Whatever the penalty, it will be recorded in your student file and on the University's plagiarism database.
