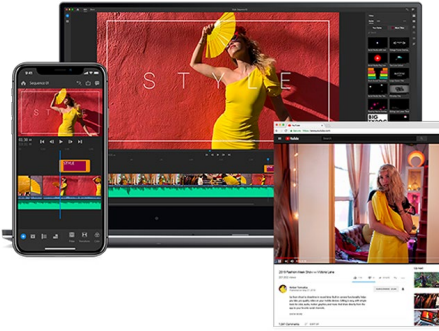


Editing Video with Adobe Premiere Rush



What to know before installing

Overview

Adobe Premiere Rush is a basic editing program that allows for quick simple edits of footage captured on your portable devices (phone/tablet) as well as imported onto desktop computers. It includes features such as trimming and cutting, visual overlays such as images and titles, and background music. It can be used on both desktop and handheld devices for free with your RMIT provided Creative Cloud membership. Premiere Rush projects are saved in the cloud, so your changes are reflected across all your devices through automatic project syncing – this means you can start editing on your laptop and finish it up on your iPad!

System Requirements

Premiere Rush works on both Windows and Mac computers, while also supporting handheld devices such as Android and iOS phones and tablets. You can determine if your device is supported on their system requirements page: <https://helpx.adobe.com/au/premiere-rush/system-requirements.html>

You will require an internet connection in order to install and activate Premiere Rush – it is also required to use the cloud-based project syncing feature.

The installation process

In order to install Premiere Rush, you will need to have the Adobe Creative Cloud desktop app installed on your computer. Follow the steps below to get started.

How to install Adobe Creative Cloud:

1. Download the [Creative Cloud desktop app](#)
2. Open the App and you will be prompted to login
3. Type your RMIT email address and press “continue”
4. Select “Company or School Account”
5. Login with your RMIT credentials
6. Once it is installed, open the Creative Cloud desktop app
7. You can now download any application available in the “All apps” tab

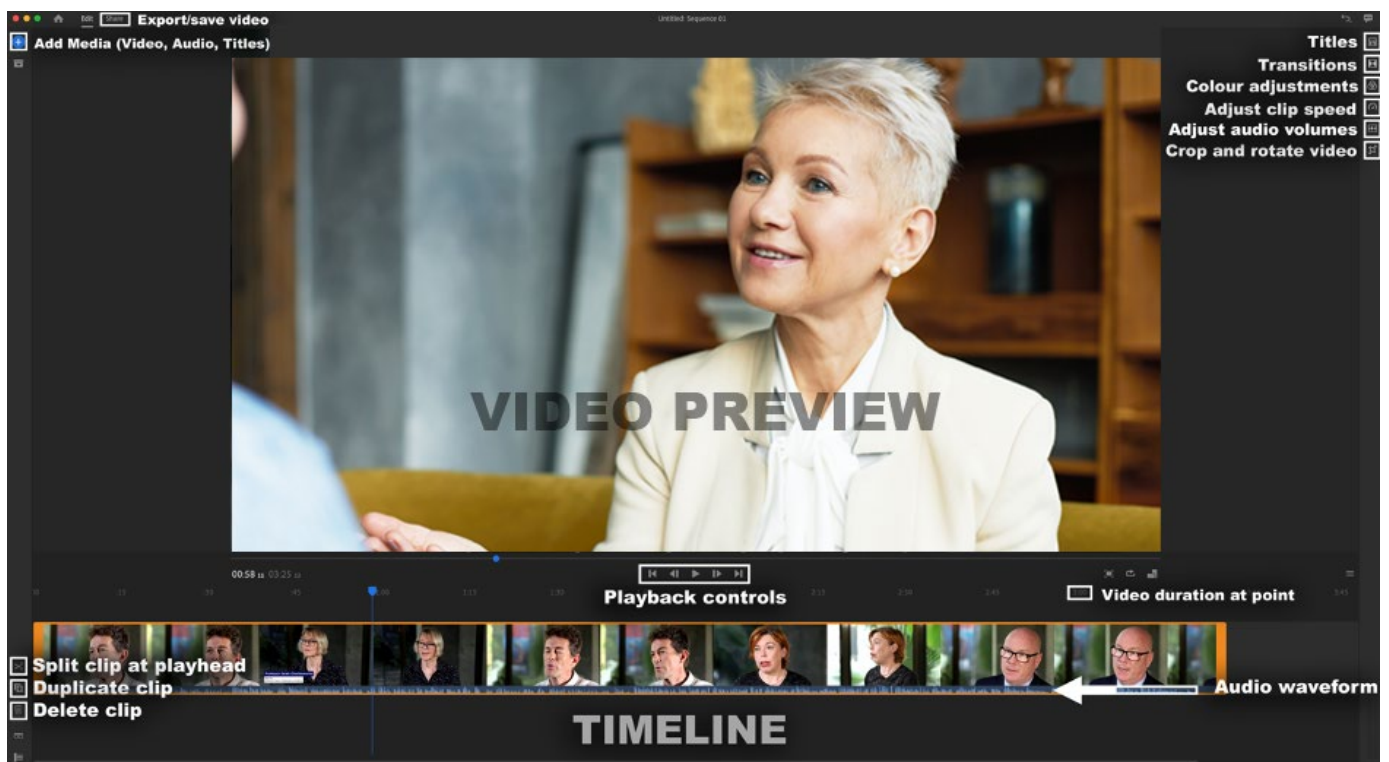
How to install Rush:

1. Open the Creative Cloud desktop app
2. Navigate to “All apps” in the left column menu
3. Find Premiere Rush in the list and click “Install”
4. Rush will now download and install
5. Once installed, click “Open”

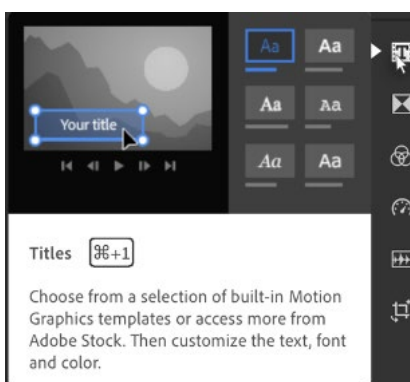
Getting started with Rush

Rush runs you through a brief yet comprehensive tutorial when you first open it – the tutorial goes through most things you will need to know (like selecting footage, adding music, exporting, etc)

Here is a general overview of the Premiere Rush interface and some of the key tools needed for most videos:



Hovering over any tool button in the program will also give you an overview of the tool's functionality. For example:

iMovie

iMovie is a video editing software application developed by Apple Inc. for macOS and iOS devices. It is free on most Apple devices such as desktop computers and iPad/iPhones (or downloadable from the App store). iMovie can do simple edits, adding titles and effects as well as music.

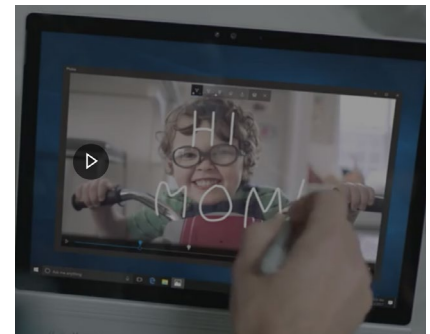

Photos (Windows)

Microsoft Photos is Microsoft's modern image organizer, graphics editor, and video editor. It was first included in Windows 8 as a functional replacement for Windows Photo Viewer.

Overview: An open source desktop app - best for simple editing and animations

Requirements:

64-bit Operating System (Linux, OS X, Windows 7/8/10)

Multi-core processor with 64-bit support

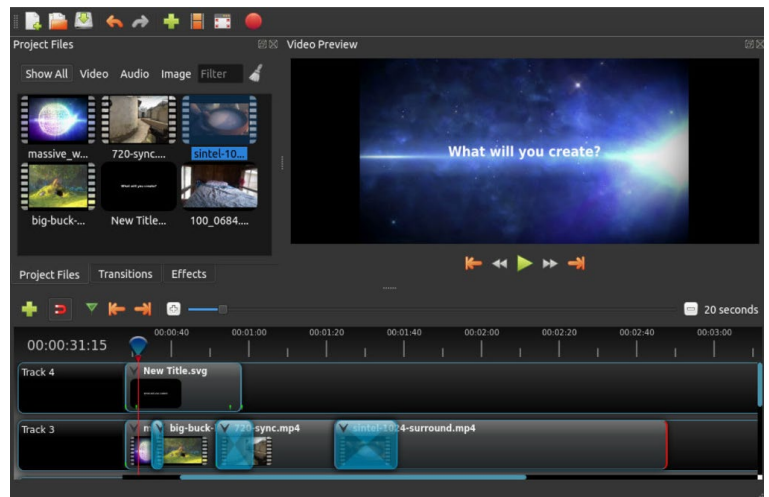
500 MB of hard-disk space for installation
